The 2nd National Conference Voltage-2020 was organized by the Faculty of Education under the topic and quote:NURTURING THE MINDS OF PROSPECTIVE TEACHERS IN WELLNESS EDUCATIONat Phase-II Campus on 6.3.2020. The objective of the conference is to create awareness on productive and proactive mind-set among the young and dynamic teacher students and to manifest a holistic approach in physical and mental health. More than 80 papers were received and 72 selected papers by the peer-reviewers were published in the conference proceedings with the ISBN 9789388568142. More than thirty delegates from various institutions and universities participated and presented the papers. The inaugural address by the chief guest Dr.K.Suresh was insightful on the perspective of teacher educators which was demonstrated lively on the stage followed by the release of the conference proceedings by the chief guest and the first copy was received by the Vice Chancellor.
