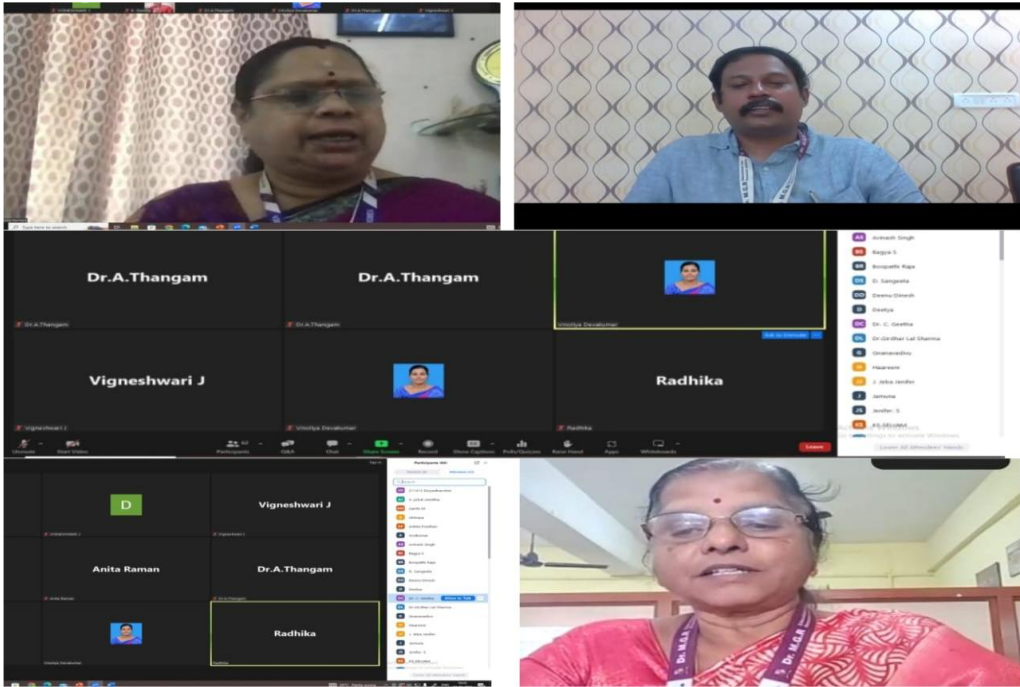


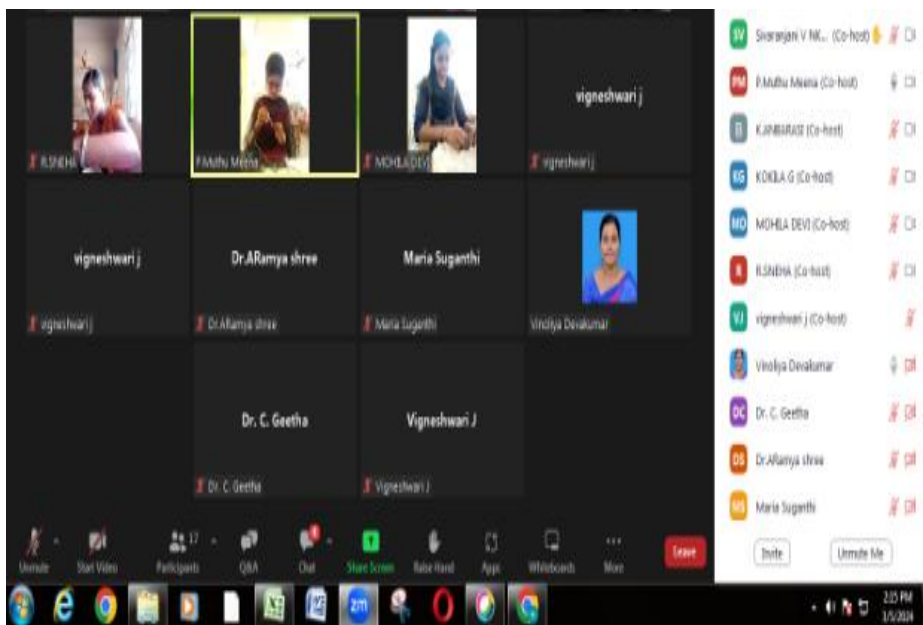
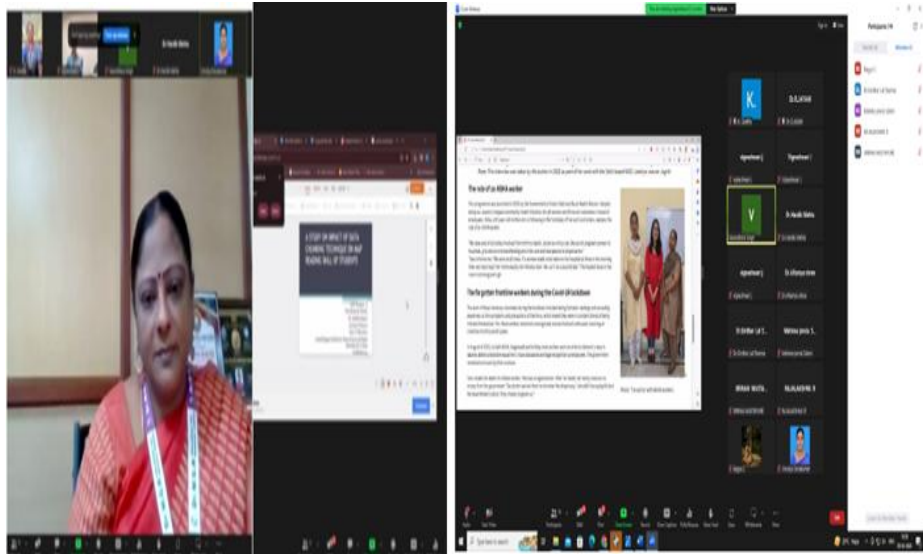
Two Day National Symposium VASITA'24
