


Day 1: 15.12.2021






- •Quoting: copying the source information word for word

- •Summarizing: creating a shortened version of the source information


















Day 2: 16.12.2021

The guest listed the following ethical principles to avoid bias in experimental design, data analysis, data interpretation, peer review,

personnel decisions, grant writing, expert testimony, and other aspects of research and listed 4 criteria define prideful authorship

- Substantial contribution to the conception and design for the data acquisition are the data analysis and interpretation
- Researcher must have contributed to draft the manuscript for critical revision of the intellectual content of the publication
- The researcher must approve the final version before publication
- The researcher must be able to accept responsibility for being accountable for the work

The session was a complete package of dos and don'ts in the journey of research.

The three-day workshop on 'Research Ethics and Management of Resources' came to the closer with the motivational valedictory address by Dr Radhika, Additional Registrar, phase 2 campus followed by the vote of thanks proposed by Dr Alma Dean Research, Stella Matutina College of Education and National Anthem.
