
Faculty of Education feels elated to share the report of the short-term course on **'Curriculum Design Development'** in collaboration with Meston College of Education, Chennai with 394








Day 2: 15.02.2022





Day 3: 16.02.2022

approach, System approach and Humanistic approach and finally insisted that curriculum makes one sharp and shows the focus on the role of the learners, teachers and the curriculum specialists.








Day 4: 17.02.2022
